Centennial Heritage .303 Rifle Match 2014

Saturday, 16 Aug 2014 saw another great .303 British Heritage Match day! This year was special, because it has been **100** years to the month since Canada, a country not yet 50 years old, went to combat in World War I, August 1914. Our soldiers carried Lee-Enfield and Ross Rifles in .303 British caliber onto grim battlefields from which many never returned. Many claim the rifles made the difference in the war. The truth is that the courage and perseverance of our soldiers, coupled with fine weapons, as in every war, brought us to victory. The Nelson district Rod & Gun Club honors that courage with the annual Heritage Match, held with some of the very rifles that were used on those battlefields. Centennial Heritage .303 Rifle Match 2014

(continued from Page 1) The day started with dark clouds and rain, but improved steadily as the match went on, which was symbolic of how those battles went for us in WW I. No wind, and a covered firing point provided optimum shooting for heritage shooters. A change this year was to allow shooters a choice to use the benches to shoot versus just prone shooting off the berm. They had no other aids to shoot, and the scores were considered fair to all. Shooters were in attendance from the U.S., and of course, throughout the Kootenays. Rifles were of all styles of .303 - Lee Enfields Marks 1, 2, 4, Ross Rifles, and sporterized versions of .303, as long as they had original issue iron sights! Shooter conversation between relays showed that the aggregate knowledge of .303 British Canadian military rifles was impressive. This knowledge, and shooting lore in general, was shared freely by all present at this match. It was certainly enough to give the new shooters a serious boost in the knowledge and experience department. The main match is shot at 100 yd, 300 yd, and 200 yd, consecutively, and provided a real challenge to shooter skill. Remembering to adjust the sights properly between distances was stressed because nobody wants to walk up to a blank target! On this day, the wind was very kind to us, and stayed very light. The Mad Minute was just that - 60 seconds to try and get 15 aimed rounds into your target at 200 yards - at 4 seconds per shot, including at least one necessary reload, it is a rare shooter who fires all 15 rounds before the whistle blows! Historically, the Mad Minute was a British Army tactic of rapid volley firing of rifles, by formed troops, to saturate an enemy position with rifle fire. It was successful enough that some enemy leaders in WW I believed it to be machine guns! The food was provided by volunteer cooking wizards who can make an ordinary BBQ produce tasty marvels! There was plenty for all, and timely served up! Cookies, cake, and beverages for every taste completed the menu and kept everyone "topped up". Jack Floyd, a very long time member of the club spoke of the historical significance and relevance of this match to Canadians, and to our American friends and allies. Trophies were awarded and concluded a great day. Dan Danforth, Active Member.
