The weather was fine. We had only 43 guests (this year we were missing the bus from Nelson Jubilee Manor, sadly) but Mountain Lake Seniors Community did send a busload and they had a great day boating, fishing, and munching on Glen's burgers while sitting around the campfire.

Family Fishing on Fathers' Day was a total success with a steady influx of guests (160 registered) who got out on the lake, fished, had lunch, and thoroughly enjoyed themselves. As in the past the kids who caught a fish were presented with a gift fishing rod & reel. One of the youngest kids, a three-year-old named Walt, caught not one but two fish! The biggest fish at 14.5 inches was a tie between Yee Lin and Ty Zukowski. Good for them!
