Wolves & Caribou - Nature in Balance?

The Canadian Press reports that a herd of caribou on Ontario's Michipicoten Island grew from eight animals in 1982 to over 700 caribou by 2013. Last year the only remaining 15 caribou – a threatened species in Ontario - were moved off the island to save them. Their demise began in 2013 when a 15-kilometre ice bridge to the island formed and four wolves made their way to the bountiful food supply.

Over five years the small pack grew to over a dozen wolves and the caribou numbers plummeted. Now the remaining six starving wolves will be captured and moved to the Isle Royale National Park in the USA where there is a surplus of moose. Stay tuned!

I, Club Policy - Financial

Current policy

Policy 20160331(b) Big Horn Sheep

- 1. The Club must pay the necessary annual costs for purchase of hay for the Big Horn Sheep Winter Feed Project.
- 3. The Club must pay up to five hundred dollars (\$500.00) in total, annually towards the cost of pick-up and transportation of the hay for the Big Horn Sheep Winter Project.

Be changed to read:

Policy- Financial Big Horn Sheep 2019-02-05 (a)

The Club will support the annual Big Horn Sheep Winter Feed Project.

- 1. The Club will arrange for the purchase and delivery of the necessary hay required for the annual project. All costs associated will be borne by the Club.
- 2. The Club will ensure that necessary maintenance of the storage unit, feed units and access is undertaken. Rational: limiting amount of financial support not workable

2. New: Club Policy -

Policy - Financial 2019-02-05 (b) Big Horn Sheep -reimbursement

- 1. The Club will provide a travel account, not to exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) annually to off set the cost of those members actively involved in the yearly Big Horn Sheep Winter Feed Project at Kootenay Pass.
 - "Actively involved" means those individual that are:
 - a. involved in the sheep feeding as the primary driver per feed day; and
 - b. confirmed by Person in charge of scheduling
- 2. Once the feed roster is established, the person in charge (PIC) will ask each individual volunteer for this project and who will be the primary driver for each feed day if they would to receive funds from the Club to offset the weekly travel expenses.
- 3. Payment will be a maximum of six dollars (\$6.00) per trip for those travelling from Ymir eastward or Trail westward to the site and a maximum of fifteen (\$15.00) per trip for those travelling from further than the above e.g. Nelson, Balfour, Castlegar,
- 4. Payment will be made at the end of the project season. The Person In Charge will provide the Treasurer a list of members involved, number of actual trips made by that indivudal and the amount to be paid to each.

The Treasurer will then, based on No. 3 and No. 4 above, distribute the funds to the maximum of one thousand dollars (\$1000.00)

5. There will be no pre-payment of the stipend. If a volunteer wishes to be paid mid project, the Directors will be required to approve early payment based on the volunteer providing a valid reason. Rationale: based on motion July 3, 2018



Sheep Feeding Program:

"Last year we had 25 sheep at the feeding site and this year our highest count was 19 and that was in December. Since then we have lost 2 lambs and an ewe as a result of motor vehicle accidents. It also appears that the sheep have split into two separate groups as one of the collared ewes from last year has been tracked being 3 miles north of the feeding station on Yellowstone Mountain. It is not known how many other sheep are with her at this time. So far it's been a good winter and the sheep feeding program continues to progress nicely."
