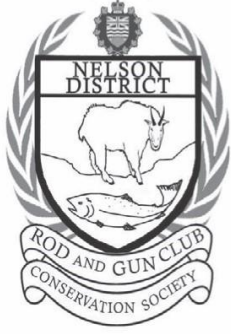

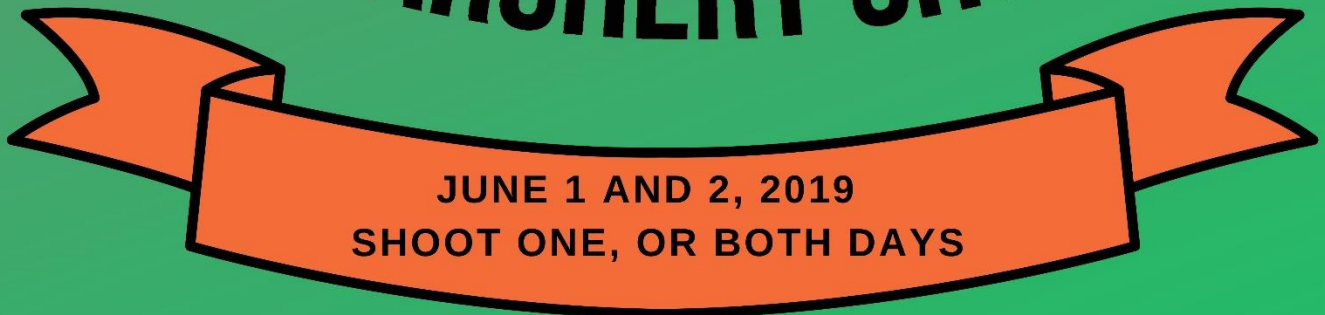

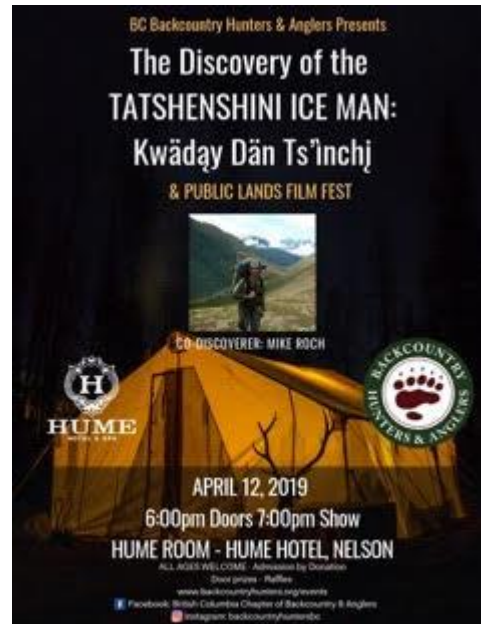
Backcountry Hunters and Anglers
