Not many of our club members would know this, but Frances Brown first became involved with the Nelson District Rod & Gun Club back in 2004, when she donated an afghan she had crocheted for our fundraiser. Little did Frances know how this contribution would impact the NDRGC 16 years later.

In 2006, Frances became a member of the NDRGC starting out as the Treasurer and joining the Constitutional Committee. She had a keen eye for detail and was a tireless worker who would pick up and do jobs that needed to be done such as taking on the Membership Committee in 2009.

Frances continued to involve herself more deeply in club affairs, acting as recording Secretary from time to time and then volunteered to become the Club Secretary in 2011.

During the next 9 years Frances submerged herself in making the NDRGC more efficient and one of the better organized Outdoor Clubs in the Kootenays. Some of her duties included

dealing with the BCWF membership system; overhauling the club constitution and bylaws, policies, adapting to the New Societies Act, and dealing with the Gaming Commission and the subsequent reports to acquire the proper gaming permits. She was also a key negotiator in having our Club House exempt from paying Nelson City property taxes until 2022.

Frances would supply floats for all club functions and could be found selling tickets at the front door for fundraising events such as our Annual Banquet and Gun Show. Frances also made herself available to do registrations for various Club activities such as Fishing Forever, Heritage Match and the Chicken Shoot.

In the spring of 2020, Frances will be moving to the Edmonton area to live with her niece. It will be a time of transition for the NDRGC but Frances has taken steps to ensure her responsibilities will be filled adequately. While Frances has small feet, her shoes are huge and it will be challenging time for those that step up.

I want to take this time to thank Frances for her years of unselfish devotion and incredible work ethic for the NDRGC. She has made a tremendous contribution in making our club a successful and financially sound organization.

On behalf of the Executive and members of the NDRGC, I want to wish Frances all the very best with her move and any future endeavors she may decide to do.

We will always remember the message on Frances home answering machine:

Predator- prey fund:

At the recent West Kootenay Outdoorsmen (WKO) meeting it was voted to continue with payments of \$500 per wolf taken in order to continue working toward predator-prey balance in the WK.

The requirements: wolf taken in the West Kootenay, including MU 04,-05, and -06 by a person who is a member in good standing of one of the West Kootenay clubs belonging to the WKO; compulsory inspection (at the moment, a legal requirement), and reporting by the applicable club president to Richard Green (WKO treasurer).

It was also decided at the WKO meeting that the clubs would be asked to decide how much they are willing to contribute to the fund. Last year five clubs put up \$1000 each. It was felt that a dollar per member should be the minimum and clubs that wished to provide more funding should be free to do so. This issue will be on the agenda at our January 14, 2020 AGM.
