President's Report

LET THE GAMES BEGIN...........The COVID 19 RANGE RULES are posted and the NDRGC outdoor range is now open. Thanks to Director Nazzy King for developing these protocols and getting them in place in a timely manner.

WOW......The spring clean-up at the outdoor range took place May 23 and 24 and what a weekend of excitement and hard work it was. Director Nazzy King did a great job organizing this and attracted a great crew of hardworking volunteers, in fact it is the largest turn out we've had in many years.

Also during the weekend, we were able to build forms for a concrete floor for the archery shelter and another form for a large concrete pad alongside the rifle range shelter. These pads were poured on Monday and Tuesday respectively and I must say they look impressive.

Wes Smith and Warren Russell worked tirelessly on the form for the archery shelter, starting on Friday and going well into Saturday afternoon. This was no easy task as heavy equipment was needed to make the ground compact and level. Most of the equipment used at the Archery shelter was supplied by Martech Electrical and NDRGC member Vic Learmonth brought in his mini excavator to help.

The 64'x12' pad at the rifle range shelter was also very challenging and NDRGC member Jamie Yasek answered the call and brought in his mini excavator to pull out rocks, level and compact the ground. Once that was done, another club member, Jamie Spence organized the construction of the form. On Monday the floor for the Archery shelter was poured in miserable wet weather. Fortun ately there was enough plastic to protect the fresh concrete. On Tuesday, the rifle range pad was poured. The weather was substantially better, but tarps were still used to protect the pad.

REMINDER: the pad alongside the rifle shelter is built for foot traffic only: IT IS NOT TO BE USED FOR THE PARKING OF ANY VEHICLES.... Our vision is to place a covered shelter on a portion of the pad within the next few years for all our members to enjoy.

The club executive retains the right to close the range without notice for inspection or maintenance, or to reduced risk to the public. Please check the website for announcements before heading out to the range.

COVID 9 OUTDOOR RANGE RULES

- 1. LIMIT EXPOSURE. Attend the Range in small groups and only travel with members of your household. Do not attend the Range if you or a member of your household is experiencing flu like symptoms. You are encouraged to use the BC Government Self Assessment Tool if you are unsure whether or not you should attend the range: https://bc.thrive.health/covid9/en
- 2. **KEEP YOUR DISTANCE**. Maintain physical distancing (2 metres or 6 feet) from other people at all times. Park vehicles 6 feet apart and away from any building entrances or pathways
- 3. **PRACTICE GOOD HYGIENE**. Due to our remote location and lack of facilities, it is <u>MANDATORY</u> that you bring your own hand sanitizer. Use hand sanitizer before and after touching common surfaces such as the gate, padlocks, sign in book, flags, target stands, etc.
 - The use of disposable gloves is encouraged
 - Cough and sneeze into your elbow or sleeve
 - Do not touch your face, eyes, nose or mouth
- 4. **SHOOTING LANE CAPACITY**. Each shooting lane is limited to individual or 2 individuals from the same household. The amount of shooting lanes open for use has been reduced. Please respect these closures:
 - Outdoor Rifle Range: Reduced to 5 shooting lanes
 - Trap Range: Reduced to 3 shooting lanes
 - Archery Range: Reduced to 2 shooting lanes

- 5. **LIMIT YOUR USE**. Limit your Range visit to 2 hours if other members are waiting to shoot. Stick to one activity per visit such as Archery, Rifle, or Trap
- 6. **EXPECT AND RESPECT CLOSURES**. The Club Executive retains the right to close the Range without advance notice for inspection or maintenance, or to reduce risk to the public

IMPORTANT CONSIDERATIONS

- ★ THE OUTHOUSES ARE CLOSED UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE
- ★ Bring your own pen for signing into the Sign In Book
- ★ Be mindful of public perception





Firearms Banned

A list of the recently prohibited firearms is available in Canada Gazette, Part II. Use Google to find it.

If you have any suspicion that you may possess one or more of the banned makes/models/variants, you should check the list. The ban was immediate – so you become a criminal if you take one of the prohibited items from your home for any reason.

There are at least two legal challenges moving forward. The CCFR (Canadian Coalition for Firearms Rights) and also a female hunter and part owner of a sporting goods store in Prince George are first off the mark. The legal process will no doubt be slow and without any guarantee. –*by Richard Green*
