
Annual General Meeting, Saturday, August 14, 2021

In my opinion:

Our federal and provincial governments are busily drafting legislation designed to troll for votes, although their spokespersons claim that the goal is to foster public safety.

Federally none of the misdirected 'gun control' legislation will actually get passed before the fall at the earliest. The legislation is designed to troll for votes from the big-city voters, especially in the Toronto area. If there is an election in the fall, as expected, then of course all pending legislation will be moot but it will be campaign talking points as 'doing something'.

In one of the current court cases opposing the May 1st attack on legal firearms owners the CCFR, the Coalition for Firearms Rights, requested the evidence on which the government based its claim that the wholesale banning of 1500+ makes and models of firearms will improve public safety. The government has refused to provide and such data. Perhaps it does not exist?

Provincially there is a draft BC Bill 4, "Firearms Violence Prevention Act" which is very timely in view of the recent spate of gang killings in BC and elsewhere in Canada. However, when reading the draft bill, it is notable that the words 'gangs' and 'gun violence' are missing. This legislation has no relationship to its title. It adds paperwork to shooting ranges, details how the province can confiscate vehicles from people who are neither charged not convicted of any offense, removes low-velocity airguns from minors, and expends the current ability of people vaguely called 'appropriate professionals' to report any suspicions they may have about their neighbours with no risk of resulting difficulties such as being sued. It is obvious that this bill cannot affect firearms violence in any way; it is just another stab at trolling for votes from uninformed big-city residents who are understandably wanting the government to 'do something'.

Since the current BC government has a majority, in order to combat this bad legislation many MLAs will have to be made aware that BC Bill 4 should be dropped permanently as it is not a solution to any known problem. To do so, google BC Bill 4, read it, and write a short message either to premier@ gov.bc.ca or (better) to Hon. John Horgan, Premier of BC, Parliament Buildings, Victoria, BC, V8V 1X4.
