
Sheep Hay Lift 2021

Team Green Fishing Trip

October 7, 2021

Wally Kampen, Glen McKen and Alan Bond joined our Vice President, Richard Green on his birthday fishing charter on October 7. Richard received the charter at his 80th birthday lunch on June 21, but if you recall late June, not good fishing weather.

The charter was with Kerry Reed's, Reel Adventures and we had Eugene, the Russian Rocket as our guide. Eugene was waiting for us, despite our being early. He had also scouted the water for a hour before to ensure a successful trip. We settled in the 22' fully enclosed Hewescraft and set out for an adventure.

Fished with downriggers 65' to 140' but all our success was on the surface. Started out pretty slow with the first fish boated 90 minutes into the trip. Fortunately we had sufficient and appropriate snacks and beverages to sustain us though the slow times. The second fish took a little less time, one hour, but then shortly after that – BANG the bite was on.

Eugene found the sweet spot and we boated 5 fish (2 released including a nice kokanee) in 40 minutes. Richard and Alan even got into a doubleheader. We all boated good rainbows about the same size. Richard, being the leader, boated two and won the largest fish prize as well. WE all went home happy and with a good feed of rainbow.



We happily paid Richard his winnings and, being a seasoned fisherman, knew his fish was just growing bigger and bigger the more he thought about it. After all it did bring in supplemental income so it must have been about THIS BIG...



The trophy is actually a recent donation from Simon Grypma; originally caught on Kootenay Lake, by his good friend Jim Young, in January, 1990 weighing 27.5 pounds. Now that we have this for display it puts a little more Rod in Rod & Gun Club!!!

The final word on the fishing trip is; it won't be over until next May. We entered all 5 heads from the rainbows we kept, in the Kootenay Lake Angler Incentive Program which recently was extended to May 2022. All rainbow and bull trout (Dollie) heads taken from the main Kootenay Lake are eligible for monthly prizes of \$1,000, in participating business merchandise, with grand prize draws early November 2021 and June 2022. Team Green is sharing whatever prizes we win from the heads submitted on October 7, 2021. Early Payment Incentive for Renewing Members!

PAL/RPAL/CORE course update

There has been surprising interest in the PAL/RPAL/CORE courses this fall. After completing the last round of training early October, now 3 weeks later the next round is almost completely subscribed.

At the time of this writing (October 24):

The January 16 PAL course has 10 seats available (double class, max 24) but the January 15 and 22 PAL courses are full.

The January 23 RPAL course has 3 seats available (maximum 24).

The January 29/30 CORE course has seats available, capacity depends on Covid rules at the time. Minimum 8 seats available currently.

We are currently looking at instructor and hall availability to determine when we can offer additional courses later in the spring.

Outdoor Ranges

Target Stand Damage

There are of handful of NDRGC volunteers that put a lot of effort into maintaining the Outdoor Range so it is suitable for our 500 plus members to use. This includes purchasing or by donation, wood/plywood to ensure there are proper target stands for us to use. These volunteers are at the range 3-4 times a week.

So, when they arrive and find that someone has used a shotgun and blasted the plywood at three different stands, it is frustrating and discouraging to say the least for them. And we all know that the price of wood these days isn't cheap.

We're not sure who is responsible for this damage. But I would ask you, our membership, to please be aware of the work that is required to maintain this shooting range. Be proud and take ownership of this little gem. This is, in my opinion, the best shooting range in the West Kootenays.

When you're at the range, do your part to casually check and make sure shooters and guests have signed in. Be aware of what is going on around you.

If you want to pattern your shotgun, bring some large cardboard or your own plywood. There are light movable metal stands that will accept your shotgun targets.

Protect our Heritage

A few thoughts re our outdoor range

We have used the current padlock on the outdoor range gate for four years. After 2022 it will be time to use a different padlock, and thus a different key. That means that I will be cutting and numbering three or four hundred keys by the end of next summer.

So far, for the current padlock, I have cut well over 600 keys. That's for a membership of just over 450 (counting family as two members). That is OK as there is a change in membership each year – some leave, others join as new members.

However, when I look at the sign-in book at the outdoor range, I do not see 600 different names. In fact, there are probably fewer than 100 different names signed in over the last three years; and there are additionally some at the trap range and some more at the archery range.

Where are the missing hundreds of people?

We have excellent facilities at Barrett Creek, and they should be used regularly and frequently by those members who shoot – rifle, shotgun, or bows.

I do not mind cutting keys, but if you are not going to use a key to the range, then do not check off on your membership renewal form that you need a key. Thank you!

Also, when I look at the sign-in book, I see that there are a few persons who do not record their key number or membership number. Is the effort too great? Of course, guests do not have a key number – but there were only two guest fee envelopes completed and placed in the yellow box as per the notice at the sign-in book. The federal government sets requirements for signing-in properly. Our insurance company also requires that attendees sign in. Please do not overlook this necessity.

One last issue – do clean up after you have used one of the ranges. If you destroy a target, then you are welcome to replace it at your own time and expense. This applies also to archers who ignore the notice prohibiting broadhead arrows – they rapidly destroy expensive targets.
