Pacific Partners Boating Bulletin

Your boat is your responsibility! Don't abandon your vessel.

Abandoned vessels and wrecks can prevent boaters from enjoying waterways in BC. Abandoned boats near public areas pose safety risks and other hazards to public health, affect infrastructure and can harm marine life. It important that every boat owner is responsible.

- The <u>Wrecked</u>, <u>Abandoned or Hazardous Vessels Act</u> protects communities and the environment by addressing concerns related to abandoned vessels.
- Through this Act, you cannot:
 - Abandon your boat.
 - Cause your boat to become a wreck because you fail to maintain it.
 - Sink, strand or ground your boat on purpose.
 - Leave your boat in poor condition in the same area for more than 60 consecutive days within a radius of 3 nm.
 - Leave your boat adrift for more than 48 hours without taking measures to secure it.
- Transport Canada monitors compliance and enforces these laws in all Canadian waters.
- The Abandoned Boats Program supports research on boat recycling and environmentally responsible boat design.



Old Boat Syndrome

Structure

- Initial construction: exposed fibreglass, soft spots in hull / floor
- Through hull fittings: improper sealing, leaks into core of hull
- Renovation / repairs: poor quality repair work on inside of hull
- · Wear and tear
- · Storage: improperly covered and drained, cracks on inner hull due to ice
- · High moisture: leaks / cracks, rotting plywood in hull and transom
- · Cracks in gel coat: evidence of impact damage
- · Paint blistering (osmosis)

Mechanical Systems

- · Improper maintenance of engines and equipment
- · Air intakes and steering systems

PAL/RPAL/CORE course update

For anyone interested in the Canadian Firearms Safety Course for long rifles (PAL) or the Canadian Restricted Firearms Safety Course for handguns (RPAL) and/or the Conservation Outdoor Recreation Education (CORE) course required to obtain a hunting license in BC, we will be providing the training again.

The next series of courses have been scheduled for:

3 X PAL courses on March 12, 13 and 19, 2022 - minimum age 12

RPAL course on March 20, 2022 - minimum age 18

CORE course on April 2/3, 2022 - minimum age 10

Note; PAL and RPAL courses are Federally regulated to 12 students per instructor which limits class capacity.

Bow/crossbow hunters do not need to complete a PAL course but do have to complete the CORE course to obtain a hunting license

PAL courses will lead to a Possession and Acquisition License required to obtain and own a long rifle that is not a restricted or prohibited firearm. Hunting rifles and shotguns require a PAL. RPAL leads to a Restricted Possession and Acquisition License required to own restricted firearms like handguns that are not prohibited. The CORE course will lead to a certificate that will lead to obtaining a Hunter Number required to get a provincial hunting license. Hunting licenses are not transferable between provinces/territories. PAL and RPAL licenses are federal and do cross provincial boundaries.
