AGM



Pacific Partners Boating Bulletin

Get your pleasure craft operator card

Boating season is on its way! If you are planning on operating a motorized pleasure craft, <u>you are required to have a Pleasure Craft Operator Card</u>(PCOC). This certification is used to make sure that boaters operating a motorized vessel understand the rules and requirements of pleasure boating.

- Always keep your Pleasure Craft Operator Card (PCOC) and a form of valid government photo identification on board when you are operating a motorized vessel, it is required by law.
 - You can earn your PCOC by taking the test through any Transport Canada accredited program.
 Click <u>here</u> for a list of accredited programs.
 - If you already have a boating certificate, it might fulfill the requirement of a PCOC card. Click here for a list of equivalent certifications.
 - Will the person operating your boat be younger than 16? There are age-horsepower restrictions that boat operators under the age of 16 must comply with.
- Would you like to review the content of the PCOC course? Review our <u>Safe Boating Guide</u>, your #1 resource for knowledge on the rules and regulations associated with pleasure boating.
- Further training is always recommended, you can never be too prepared to be on the water. Take extra courses designed for the type of boating that you will be operating and gain valuable knowledge to make your boating experiences safer and more enjoyable.

What is it? For Boaters: A Pleasure Craft Operator Card (or equivalency) is proof of competency to operate a pleasure craft.		For a Boat: A Pleasure Craft Licence is a document with a unique licence number for a pleasure craft. The number (e.g., in the format <i>BC11111</i> or <i>11K1111</i>), serves as identification for the boat.	For a Boat: Registration is a title system for boat ownership. Registration provides you with an official number for your boat, and a unique name. *A pleasure craft must be either registered or licensed.					
The law says:	Anyone who operates a power-driven pleasure craft must provide proof of competency.	*A pleasure craft must be either registered or licensed. Any pleasure craft powered by a motor 10 hp (7.5 kW) or more must have a valid licence.	Registration is required if the boat is not used as a pleasure craft (i.e., carrying paying passengers), or if it will be used abroad for extended periods of time.					
What is the purpose?	A Pleasure Craft Operator Card is proof of competency that shows you understand the basic rules for safely operating a pleasure craft. The most common proof of competency is the Pleasure Craft Operator Card.	A pleasure craft licence allows search and rescue personnel and other agencies to quickly identify who to contact if your pleasure craft is found or in an emergency. The PCL is not proof of ownership.	You may choose to register your pleasure craft with the Canadian Register of Vessels if you wish to have an approved name and port of registry for your boat, to get a marine mortgage, or show proof of ownership.					
How do I get it?	You can get a Pleasure Craft Operator Card bytaking a boating safety course in-person or online with a Transport Canada accredited course provider, and passing the test at the end of the course. https://tc.canada.ca/en/marine-transportation/marine-safety/proof-competency-recreational-boaters#s2	A pleasure craft can be licenced online on the Transport Canada website or by mail. https://tc.canada.ca/en/marine-transportation/marine-safety/licensing-pleasure-craft	A pleasure craft may be registered by submitting an application form and supporting documents with payment to Transport Canada's Vessel Registration Office. https://tc.canada.ca/en/marine-transportation/vessel-licensing-registration/registering-canadian-register-vessels-first-time-registration					
What is the cost?	Fees for the course and exam are set by the course provider.	There is no fee for a Pleasure Craft Licence .	There are various fees to register a boat, amend registration information, and add or discharge a marine mortgage from the registry.					
How long is it valid?	A Pleasure Craft Operator Card is valid for life.	A Pleasure Craft Licence is valid for ten years.	Registered information is valid for three years.					
Where should I keep it?	A Pleasure Craft Operator Card must be carried when operating a powered pleasure craft.	A Pleasure Craft Licence must be carried and the license number displayed on both sides of the pleasure craft's bow above the waterline, in block characters that are at least 3 inches high, and in a contrasting colour that stands out.	The Certificate of Registry must be on board the boat at all times. The boat must be marked (name, port of registry, registered tonnage, and official number) according to the requirements noted on the back of your Certificate of Registry.

PAL/RPAL/CORE course update

Restricted Firearms Safety Course for handguns (RPAL) and/or the Conservation Outdoor Recreation Education (CORE) course required to obtain a hunting license in BC, we have scheduled additional courses.

There have been two PAL and one more RPAL courses scheduled this spring and there are a few available seats in the April 2/3 CORE:

- CORE course on April 2/3, 2022 minimum age 10
- 2 X PAL courses on April 24 and April 30, 2022 minimum age 12
- RPAL course on May 1 20, 2022 minimum age 18
 - Note; PAL and RPAL courses are Federally regulated to 12 students per instructor which limits class capacity.
 - Bow/crossbow hunters do not need to complete a PAL course but do have to complete the CORE course to obtain a hunting license

PAL courses will lead to a Possession and Acquisition License required to obtain and own a long rifle that is not a restricted or prohibited firearm. Hunting rifles and shotguns require a PAL. RPAL leads to a Restricted Possession and Acquisition License required to own restricted firearms like handguns that are not prohibited. The CORE course will lead to a certificate that will lead to obtaining a Hunter Number required to get a provincial hunting license. Hunting licenses are not transferable between provinces/territories. PAL and RPAL licenses are federal and do cross provincial boundaries.
