3 piece Take down hybrid Longbow 50# draw @ 28", 64" length

Riser:

Zebrawood and Paduak, with Paduak and Maple Burl overlavs

Limb mount laminate is Purpleheart

Grip is medium wrist

Sight window cut 1/8" past center, with radiused shelf

Limbs:

Shallow reflex/deflex form

Back is clear glass over Wenge and Yew laminate Core laminates are maple and bamboo

Belly is black glass

Tip overlays are black and white phenolic under a riser matching

Limb butt overlay is Maple Burl

Included is 12 strand High Speed string, cat whisker silencers, single nock point Arrow rest installed

The bow has a very smooth draw, quiet, and very

fast!

I look forward to outdoor season with this great group of archers. #### PAL AND CORE COURSES

Dorian Boswell is providing PAL, RPAL and CORE training courses at our Mickey McEwen Memorial Hall in 2023.

Those interested in the safe handling of long rifles and shotguns, need the Canadian Firearms Safety Courses (PAL, for unrestricted long rifles and shotguns) at a cost of \$140. Safe handling of all common firearms and safe shooting techniques are taught. Classes are limited to 12 persons per instructor. Minimum age for PAL is 12. These are one day courses, including testing time. The next scheduled courses are April 22 + 23, 2023.

The Conservation and Outdoor Recreation Education (CORE) two-day course includes practical firearm handling and a written examination on conservation, ethics, Indigenous peoples and hunting in BC, BC law and regulations, first aid and survival, firearms safety, and animal and bird identification. This course is required to get a BC hunting licence. The minimum age is 10 and costs \$160 per student. The CORE course is scheduled for April 29/30, 2023.

These will be the last PAL and CORE courses before Limited Entry Hunting draws close for this hunting season and the last courses offered until September (after the fall hunting season starts).

Dorian is also organizing RPAL courses for those interested in the Canadian Firearms Safety Course required to obtain a Restricted Possession and Acquisition Licence (RPAL). Classes are limited to 12 persons per instructor. The RPAL courses will be provided on a demand basis, so you need to contact Dorian for further information. A PAL is a prerequisite to obtain a RPAL. Minimum age is 18 and cost is \$100 per student.

There are manuals available for club members (and immediate family) for these courses. Supplies are limited, a manual is mandatory for the CORE course but not mandatory for PAL or RPAL, although prereading is recommended. Contact Alan Bond at 250 352-2289 to borrow a club manual.

# **Pacific Partners Boating Bulletin**

## **Locations for Returning Expired Flares in BC**

Properly disposing of expired flares is a large and growing problem for many recreational boaters in Canada. There are laws that require distributors to take expired flares back from the public, but most retailers are not included as distributors.

Please find the attached PDF document that lists some locations in British Columbia for returning expired flares.

Canadian Power Sail Squadron also conducts flare disposal days and education events in BC. The events can be found on the CPS website - <u>CPS | Safety Equipment and Flare Disposal Days - CPS (cps-ecp.ca)</u>. These events collect all brands of flares from the boating public for no cost. Reach out to a local squadron to schedule an event in your area.

#### **Distress Flares**

When buying distress flares, look for a Transport Canada approval stamp or label. Remember that flares are only good for four years from the date of manufacture, which is stamped on every flare. Store your flares within reach and vertically in a cool, dry location (such as a watertight container) to keep them in good working condition. Always follow the manufacturer's recommendations for safe storage.

### Tips on Using Flares

You may use flares only in an emergency when you believe there is a chance of it being seen. Fire aerial flares at an angle into the wind. In strong wind, lower the angle to 45 degrees, at most. Always read the manufacturer's instructions before you use flares.


