
President's Message Howie Grant


LEGACY PROJECT

Archery Canada Outdoor Mailmatch June 1, 2023 - September 30, 2023

Outdoor Mailmatch is a National Competition shot in the comfort of your own club! Due to the vast geography of our country, it can be difficult to attend all National competitions, but the desire to see where you stand against other Canadian Archers is still there. Mailmatch allows for this to happen without having to travel further than your local club. Each week an archer can submit one score and the average of your six top scores shot throughout the designated period will be used to determine your final placing. All categories shoot a 720 round at 50m, or 12 ends of 6 arrows.

\$10 per archer, per category, all Archery Canada divisions recognized for Outdoor Target Archery are represented, except for Under 10. You must be a BC Archery member to participate.


Championship's Gold Medal Plates. This was followed by two consecutive invites to participate in the Gold Plates.

Pacific Partners Boating Bulletin Safe Boating Awareness Week 2023

Careless Operation and Boating Sober

Avoid Dangerous Behaviours

Never try to spray swimmers, or cut in front of or try to jump the wake of other vessels. Some of the worst boating incidents happen when operators misjudge speed or distance.

Operate at a Safe Speed

Remember that you may have to stop or turn suddenly to avoid a collision, so operate at a safe speed. A safe speed depends on:



- your ability to see ahead slow is the only safe speed in fog, mist, rain and darkness;
 - current, wind, and water conditions;
 - how quickly your boat can change direction;
 - how many and what types of vessels are near you; and
 - the presence of navigational hazards such as rocks and tree stumps.

Be very careful when boating where visibility is poor, such as entering or exiting a fog bank.

A boat's wake can damage other vessels, docks, and the shoreline. It can also be a risk for swimmers, divers and people on small boats that might capsize. Be aware of how your boat's wake might affect others when choosing your speed. You will be responsible for any damages or harm you cause.

Impaired driving on the water

Boating under the influence of alcohol, or drugs is illegal. It is also a danger to yourself and others. Staying sober is your responsibility. Boating while drinking or taking drugs can lead to dangerous situations. When boating impaired, you are not just a danger to yourself but to others too. Each time you operate a boat, you are responsible for the safety of your guests and other people using the waterway. You must always be prepared and alert. Mixing alcohol and drugs with boating is far more dangerous than you may realize. Fatigue, sun, wind, and the motion of the boat may dull your senses. Alcohol and drugs intensify these effects, leaving you with reduced fine motor skills (for example, hand-eye coordination) and impaired judgement.

Consequences

Impaired driving, whether on land or water, is punishable under the Criminal Code of Canada.



Convictions for a first offence can result in:

• fines

- prohibition from operating a boat or motor vehicle
 - seizure of the boat for a period of time
 - possible prison terms

The laws and penalties for when a boater is considered impaired follow provincial and territorial driving laws.

Have your say on the proposed changes to the Small Vessel Regulations

The proposed changes to the <u>Small Vessel Regulations</u> for licensing a pleasure craft have been published in the Canada Gazette, Part I. You have until **July 12, 2023** to provide comments and feedback on these proposed regulations.

How to provide comments

What are the proposed changes?

The proposed amendments to the *Small Vessel Regulations* would enhance the quality of data collected in the Pleasure Craft Electronic Licensing System by:

- establishing a 5-year validity period for all pleasure craft licences including those with lifetime licences
- reducing the timeframe for licence holders to provide a change of information (i.e., name or address) from 90 days to 30 days
- requiring the new owner of a pleasure craft to apply to transfer a pleasure craft licence upon purchasing the pleasure craft.
- expanding the Pleasure Craft Licensing requirements to include wind-powered pleasure craft above 6 metres in length. These updated requirements would not apply to human-powered pleasure craft, such as kayaks, canoes, and dragon boats.
- providing the Minister of Transport with the ability to cancel a pleasure craft licence for noncompliance or upon a licence holder's request.

The proposed changes would also include:

- introducing a \$24 fee for an initial (new), renewal, transfer, or a replacement pleasure craft licence. The proposed fee is different from earlier consultations to reflect the increasing delivery costs of providing the service.
 - adjusting the \$24 fee to keep pace with inflation.
- formalizing the current practice for Manufacturer Identification Code (MIC) holders to update their contact information within 30 days of the change.

What is a pleasure craft license

A pleasure craft licence is a document issued by Transport Canada which contains a unique licence number used to identify a vessel. This number allows authorities and search and rescue personnel to access important information in an emergency. It also supports efforts to maintain accountability and compliance with safety and environmental regulations.

What's next.

Comments and feedback received during this consultation period will help inform the next step of the regulatory process which is publication in the *Canada Gazette*, Part II. Following the publication of the Regulations in the *Canada Gazette*, Part II, the regulations will come into force.
