


The range will be closed while the meeting is in progress Bring hearing protectors so we can use the range afterwards...Maybe a little friendly competition.






ARCHERY

Hosted by the Kamloops Bowbenders, Jordan Braun and I arrived at the 3D Provincials in Kamloops on Friday June 16th. The first things we noticed were the strong gusts of winds and the lack of trees in the area. After getting our equipment checked, we proceeded to the practice range. The forceful gusts of wind seem to come from all directions and at different strengths. As I let go of my first arrow at a target 30 yards away, I could literally see my arrow dancing in the wind. I looked over at Jordan and the same thing was happening with his compound bow. Later that evening, as I was setting my tent up in the wind, I was hoping that the weather would cooperate over the next two days.

Day one consisted of two courses of 20 targets. Set on rolling hills, amongst sage brush and gullies, the wind gusts were continuously present. The wheels, or compounds, started on course A; and the sticks, or traditional bows, started on course B. Course B began with targets placed along a gully, making ranging difficult. A good mix of target sizes and distances kept us guessing at every target. The competition was strong this year, with almost double the attendance compared to the Provincials in Cranbrook last year. With 3D archery, it always feels like I am going out shooting with friends and the camaraderie is strong. Two and a half hours later, we all regrouped at the main venue for lunch. Everyone was looking a bit redder from the sun, especially with no shade in sight. Course A started with a long hill climb for my group starting on target number 17. We began with a majestic buck, a very large target shot from approximately 30 meters away. This is the maximum distance allowed for my division, and it made the large target closer than it appeared. This seemed to be the theme for course A: long shots at very deceiving targets.

Day two was much cooler, with rain visible in the distance and stronger wind. This time the wheels started on course B, and we started on A, shooting pegs and targets that had shifted slightly overnight. Thankfully, the rain held off until the very last target of the day. We all reunited at the main venue, soaked and tired from the weekend, but everyone had a great time. Next stop will be Cranbrook for 3D Nationals—see you there!
